COURSE OBJECTIVE: To introduce students to Shakespeare through a study of eleven representative plays; to introduce students to the rudiments of Elizabethan English in order to facilitate their reading of the plays; to understand each play as theater--as works not only to be read but to be seen and heard.

GRADING: Course grades will be based on two hour tests (25 % each) and two take-home tests (25% each).
