This course directs students to study Appalachian Englishes, including their histories, sociolinguistic statuses, and current variations. We will also explore the stereotypes surrounding Appalachian Englishes, including their media representations. Through active research, we will describe the intersections of language and society in Appalachia and discuss how to best combat the prejudices against Appalachians and their dialects.

We will focus on gaining

- an understanding of the linguistic and social constraints on Appalachian Englishes.
- respect for human language, including vernacular variation.
- knowledge of Appalachia's diachronic and synchronic language variation.
